CPT Sam Downing was born and raised in Wyoming and Colorado and thoroughly enjoyed the outdoor sports and lifestyle for that region of the US. He received his regular Army commission through ROTC at the University of Wyoming. He served 5 years on active duty as a Ranger-Airborne-Infantry Officer, plus an additional 7 years in the Reserves.

During his active duty, he was stationed at Fort Benning, GA, in command positions at Illesheim Army Airbase in Germany and Vietnam, and with ACSI (Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence) as a briefing officer at the Pentagon. He served a majority of his tour in Vietnam in combat as a Rifle Company Commander with Charlie Company, 1/18<sup>th</sup> Infantry, 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division. Charlie Company (also known as Dogface Charlie), had a noteworthy period of service before, during and after Downing's command time. The First Infantry Division Museum later published two books about the company's time in Vietnam. For his actions in Vietnam Sam received a Purple Heart, two Bronze Star Medals, and a Silver Star Medal.

He received his Bachelors in Business Administration from the University of Wyoming, and an MBA from the University of Denver after his active duty service. His post-service civilian career included almost 35 years in a mix of real estate finance, development, and construction, as well as renovation and management of several historic hotels. After retiring from those real estate activities, he served for 6 years in the Resolutions and Receiverships Division of the FDIC during the 2008-2016 financial/banking crisis.

Sam and his wife Jan retired (mostly) to Aiken in 2015, and have learned that retirement is almost a full-time job. They jointly have five children, five grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.
